Read these grammar rules and choose the correct answers:

Since is used for a specific time. *e.g.: since* 8 *o'clock*

For is used for general periods of time. *e.g.: for two weeks*

We use **already** in affirmative statements. It goes between the auxiliary verb and the perfect participle form.

e.g.: Mary has *already* baked a cake.

We use **yet** in questions and negative sentences. It goes at the end of the sentence. *e.g.: Have you seen it yet?*

You can make the sentence negative if you put **never** between have/has and the past participle form of the verb. This time you mustn't negate the verb. *e.g. I have never been here.*

Ever is mostly used in <u>interrogative sentences (tázacích větách</u>). It goes between have/has and the past participle form. *e.g. Have you ever been here?*

Still is used in negative sentences in present perfect. It goes before the negative form of the <u>auxiliary verb</u> (<u>pomocného slovesa</u>). *e.g.: I still haven't done it.*

Just is used in affirmative sentences in present perfect. It goes between have/has and the past participle form.

e.g.: I have **just** heard it.

We use **recently**/ **lately** in each sentence. It goes at the end of the sentence. *e.g.: She hasn't been here lately*.
