Read these grammar rules and choose the correct answers:

Since is used for a specific time.

e.g.: **since** 8 o'clock

For is used for general periods of time.

e.g.: **for** two weeks

We use **already** in affirmative statements. It goes between the auxiliary verb and the perfect participle form.

e.g.: Mary has **already** baked a cake.

We use **yet** in questions and negative sentences. It goes at the end of the sentence.

e.g.: Have you seen it **yet**?

You can make the sentence negative if you put **never** between have/has and the past participle form of the verb. This time you mustn't negate the verb.

e.g. I have **never** been here.

Ever is mostly used in interrogative sentences (tázacích větách). It goes between have/has and the past participle form.

e.g. Have you **ever** been here?

Still is used in negative sentences in present perfect. It goes before the negative form of the auxiliary verb (pomocného slovesa).

e.g.: I **still** haven't done it.

Just is used in affirmative sentences in present perfect. It goes between have/has and the past participle form.

e.g.: I have **just** heard it.

We use **recently/ lately** in each sentence. It goes at the end of the sentence.

e.g.: She hasn't been here **lately**.
